2. What do you think will happen to the characters next?
3. Roxie's relationship with other characters may not be what you'd expect. How do you think that relationship changed the way she interacts with other characters?
4. Because of past events, Roxie is forced to grow up quicker than most teens. How do you think your teenage self would have behaved at the end of the book?
5. Roxie's dad, Jack, jumps to big decisions very quickly. What did you think of his character before you realized the reasoning behind his behavior?

1. The main character suffers from a type of mental illness. Do you have a new perspective after reading this book?
2. There are many interesting characters through the book. If you could invite one character over to your house for dinner, who would it be? Why?
3. What was unique about the setting of the book? How did it enhance or take away from the story?
4. The circumstance that sets the book in motion is called the inciting moment. What was the inciting moment of this book?
5. Did you pick up on any symbolism in the story? What do these objects actually mean? How do the characters interact with these objects?
